# **HUD REAC INSPECTION NOTICE**



The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has contracted with a private company to conduct a physical inspection of our Housing Authority. HUD requires this physical inspection of all Housing Authorities as part of the PUBLIC HOUSING ASSESSMENT SYSTEM (PHAS). We have been informed that our Housing Authority will be inspected October 11-14, 2022. This physical inspection is similar to the inspections conducted previously.

The inspector will begin at 9:00 a.m. daily. The inspection schedule is as follows:

- October 11-12 -AMP 1, Lawndale, Dixon, Madison, 303 and 305 Fagan and 423 South Ingram.
- October 13-14 AMP 2, Fagan, Dixon and Ingram, North Adams, Eighth Street and 840 North Adams

There may be an additional Quality Assurance Inspection (QAI) 5 to 8 business days following the inspection.

Not all apartments will be inspected; the inspector will randomly select a percentage of apartments from each development. You are not required to be present during the inspection. The Housing Authority Staff will leave a note in your apartment if you are not at home advising you that the Housing Authority Staff and the HUD REAC Inspector were there.

Housing Authority staff will always be with the Inspector. Remember; keep your apartments and yards clean and in good condition. It is important that you call in all of your work orders.

**Medicare's Annual Enrollment Period is** right around the corner. It is from October 15, 2022, to December 7, 2022. If you are like everyone else, you are getting dozens of phone calls every day trying to get you to switch your plan. You might wish you had a magic button you could use to turn off the calls, and here are some tips.

# 800 numbers and unsolicited phone calls

- 1) Never call an 800 number you see in an ad.
- 2) Never give your Medicare ID number to someone you don't know over the phone.
- 3) Never click on or fill out forms online or on Facebook.

# The promise of Getting \$170 per month back or a Flex Card

You see the television commercials, phone calls, and mail regarding "new benefits and plan changes." Most people don't qualify for the advertised benefits but are coerced into something else.

The government recently issued strict new rules regarding advertising, but it hasn't stopped the overseas call centers.

# Review your plan.

Each plan sends out an annual Notice of Change (ANOC) by the end of September, read and see if any of the changes affect you. Many times the plan changes are to your benefit. Some of the plans this year will have financial help for you to pay your utilities, over-the-counter items, and food.

Use trusted professionals in our community that know and work full-time in the Medicare business. If you don't know of someone, ask another trusted friend and look for those active in our community that helps others with Medicare.

# 2022 ANNUAL PLAN

The Housing Authority's Board of Commissioners, Staff and Resident Advisory Board will be meeting during the months of October and November to work on the Authority's draft of our Annual Plan. - Fagan/Dixon Ingram ADA Upgrades, Replace Remodel Bathrooms, Install Ceiling Fans, Storm and Entrance Doors
- PHA Wide Landscape/Remove and Bushes Removal, Replace Sidewalk, Purchase Property

### Rent:

# Rent payments are due on the 1st day of every month.

All rent paid after the 10<sup>th</sup> is late and could affect future renewals or referrals to other landlords.

The late fee of \$25.00 that some residents pay on a monthly basis is costing your family \$300.00 per year. \$300.00 is a lot of extra money to pay, so please plan to make a change from this habit.

Tax time is right around the corner and you could pay on time or even ahead, Spend the \$300.00 on something you and your family will enjoy.

The head of household needs to report all changes in all household income and assets and family composition within 10 days.

Failure to report changes will result the household having to re-pay any monies due.

Laundries at 840 N. Adams and Fagan Hall: Laundries are for resident use only. This is the only way we can keep the load, price at fifty cents. The Housing Authority currently loses money on every load. Residents bringing in outside laundry or family member's laundry is not allowed.

**HUD'S Overnight Policy:** HUD's policy and your signed lease states that you are allowed to have an overnight guest for 14 total overnights per year, per household guest for 14 total overnights per year, per household.

Fall Leaf Season: Families are responsible for raking their own leaves. We ask that you bag your own leaves and the Housing Authority will remove them for you. You will be charged a fee if we have to rake your leaves. We have bags at the office to give you and will loan you a rake if you need one.

**Pets:** Residents are responsible to pick up pet waste as it occurs and dispose of it properly. Please do not feed stray cats and animals.

### Housekeeping tips:

- Wash refrigerator door gasket with clean soapy water to avoid loss of coolness and your electric bill being higher from not sealing. Your food will also stay fresher if the door seals tightly.
- Self-cleaning Gas Stoves

  To save time scrubbing, put the burner grates in the stove when you use the self-clean feature.
- Clean carpet spills as you go using warm water or a spot cleaner. It will save time and be easier to clean.
- Check your produce especially onions and potatoes and your sacks for unwanted pests when you get home from the grocery to avoid an infestation of bugs.
- Flushable wipes, tampons, and sanitary napkins are not safe in the toilet.
- Wipe household surfaces on a regular basis and your whole family will be healthier.
- Dryer lint should be cleaned out after every use. This will save you money on your electric bill. It is the resident's responsibility to make sure the dryer vent is always clamped and tight. This is the leading cause of fires.
- Window frames and entry doors need to be wiped with a bleach-water solution to avoid condensation turning into mildew problems.
