


National Fair Housing Month



Join us in celebrating National Fair Housing Month

National Fair Housing Month celebrates the passage of the Fair Housing Act.

This year, we commemorate the 55th anniversary of the passage of the Fair Housing Act, the landmark civil rights law signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson on April 11, 1968, that made discrimination in housing transactions unlawful. The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in housing because of race, color national origin, religion, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), disability, and familial status.

Fundamentally, fair housing means that every person can live free. This means that our communities are open and welcoming, free from housing discrimination and hostility. But this also means that each one of us, regardless of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, familial status, and disability, has access to neighborhoods of opportunity, where our children can attend quality schools, our environment allows us to be healthy, and economic opportunities and self-sufficiency can grow.

Our commitment to fair housing is a living commitment, one that reflects the needs of America today and prepares us for a future of true integration.

In accordance with State, Federal and Local Housing laws, the Housing Authority of Henderson (HAH) shall not:

Discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, familial status, religion, or disability in the leasing, rental, or other disposition of housing or related facilities, including land, and in any development or developments under its jurisdiction.

The HAH shall provide upon request, reasonable accommodation, including auxiliary aids and services, to afford an individual with a disability an equal opportunity to participate in all services, programs and activities offered at the Housing Authority.

RENT COLLECTION POLICY



Rent and other charges (i.e., utilities, work orders) are due and payable on the first day of each month. A late charge of \$25.00 will be assessed and an eviction notice will be issued to the resident if rent and charges are not paid in full by the 10th of the month. If rent is paid by a personal check and the check is returned for any reason, this shall be considered a non-payment of rent and the resident will incur the late charge, plus an additional charge of \$25.00 for bank charges and processing fees. The Housing Authority of Henderson will not accept cash payments. All rent and other charges must be paid by check, money order or credit card/debit card.

Payment can be mailed or paid in person at The Housing Authority of Henderson, 111 South Adams Street, Henderson, Kentucky 42420. For your convenience, you can pay online at apps@hahenderson.org. There will be a \$3.00 processing fee for any electronic payment. In addition, residents may use the after-hours drop box located at the front entrance of Barret Center for payments.

NON-PAYMENT OF RENT

Any resident that fails to pay all of their rent and charges by the 30th day of the month shall be subject to eviction, pursuant to Section 18(a) (b) of the Housing Authority of Henderson's Dwelling Lease.

Additional costs (i.e., filing, service, attorney, and other legal fees) associated with taking court action for non-payment of rent and charges shall be added to the resident's account balance.

Workorders:

Grass Mowing Season:

As a reminder, residents must remove any personal items from the grass areas around their housing unit that areas that areas mowed or trimmed, including items such as children's toys, bikes, flower pots, etc. Mowers are not responsible for damage done to items that you leave in their work area.

Pets:

This is reminder of the pet policy regarding tying up pets outside to bushes or stakes etc.

A. All residents with pets shall comply with the following:

- 6. No animal shall be permitted to **roam freely outdoors**. When the pet is taken outside, the animal <u>must</u> be on a leash **and under the direct control of the owner**. The pet must be kept off other resident's lawns. An unleashed pet, or one tied to a fixed object, is not considered to be under the control of an adult.
 - 17. Residents are **prohibited** from feeding or harboring stray animals/birds. The feeding of stray animals shall constitute having a pet without the written permission of the Housing Authority of Henderson, which would be considered violation of this policy.

Trash:

Please throw all trash in dumpsters and not on the ground. Please let us know if you see visitors littering on the property. Please throw trash away in bags and close the lids to diminish the smell.

Spring Clean Up:

It is time to clean up porch areas and remove items that should not be there. You can have outdoor furniture only on the porch area. No household furniture (wood tables or chairs, cloth indoor chairs kitchen chairs or metal chairs) should be left on porches. The only exception is furniture you have called in for maintenance to dispose of for you.

Laundries:

Laundries at 840 N. Adams And Fagan Hall: The laundries are for resident use only. This is the only way we can keep the price at fifty cents. THE HOUSING AUTHORITY LOSES MONEY ON EVERY LOAD. Residents bringing in outside laundry for family members laundry is not allowed.

Children:

Children are out and about playing in the developments. Please slow down and watch closely for them.

AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS:


Effective afterschool programs provide learning settings that bring a wide range of benefits to youth, families, and communities.
