Those who are interested must pre-register. You may either sign a "Register Form" which will be provided in the laundry facilities on Tuesday, September 6, or you may call the main office to register. You must also specify the vaccine (s) for which you are registering.

Verifications for Social Security:

The Social Security Administration is asking that you do not come to the local office to get a verification of income. The Housing Authority will accept the letter that comes to you in the mail in December with the income for the following year. You can bring it in when you receive it, and we will copy it and keep it until recertification time. There are also other ways to get proof of Social Security income

- 1. Call 1-800-772-1213
- 2. Set up an online account and you can get information any time you wish.

The Housing Authority has a kiosk with step-by-step instructions on how to set up the account and a printer to print the information. This is a free service we offer the resident.

Tents and Canopies:

All tents and canopies must be taken down to allow our mowing service to do their job. If you would like to put one up for a special event you must remove the same day. Residents may keep their personal belongings on the concrete areas and in their yard barn.

Complaints:

If you are having an issue with a neighbor who is breaking the law, call the police department and give our manager a written complaint. It restricts the property Manager from enforcing the lease agreement if there is no written complaint.

Pets:

Residents are responsible to pick up pet waste as it occurs and dispose of it properly. Please do not feed stray cats and animals.

Visitors:

As in accordance with your lease, residents have 14 days per year of visitation. This is a total of all visitors, each day. If you would like to add someone to your lease, contact our office. Violators will be given a lease violation notice. Residents who allow guests to stay past the 14-day limit are subject to lease termination.

Reminder:

Please remember that car washing, pools, or hooking hoses or sprinklers with water from your apartment is not allowed, per your lease.

Laundries at 840 N. Adams and Fagan Hall: Laundries are for resident use only. This is the only way we can keep the price at fifty cents. The Housing Authority loses money on every load. Residents bringing in outside laundry or family member's laundry is not allowed.

Smokers in Public Housing:

HUD implemented a rule that requires all Housing Authorities to have a smoke free policy, effective June 5, 2017. This policy states no smoking in any Public Housing Apartment is allowed. Smoking outside must be 25 feet away from any door or window.

We will terminate leases of those who continue to smoke in the non-smoking apartments.

Senior Companion Program







Would you like help make a difference in your community? As a Senior Companion you will help other seniors in your community stay as independent for as long as possible. You will also help give family/caregivers a well-deserved break. We serve 7 counties including: Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, McLean, Ohio, Union and Webster. Our services are at no cost to the clients.

- What's expected: Light housekeeping, meal preparation, Shopping/errands, Companionship, and/or respite.
- Hours Served: A minimum of 20 hours a week, 4 hours a day.
- Benefits: As a volunteer you will receive paid training and earn \$250+ (tax-free) per month.
- Requirements: Volunteers must be 55 or older and meet the income eligible requirements.

Monday - Friday 8:00 am - 11:00 am 2:00 pm - 4:00 pm.

- All household members age 18 years and older must be present to sign.
- You must have Social Security Cards for all members of the household.
- Birth Certificates must be provided for all household members and a photo ID for all adults.
- If anyone is pregnant a statement must be presented as to due date.
- For Public Housing you must have proof of income.
 There may also be other documents that may be needed. You can come to the office and pick up a list that show what other documents will be needed.

840 Re-Certifications:

840 Re-Certifications are due 9-1-22-9-30-22. Justina will be at 840 REC Hall on September 8th, 8:30 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. and 1:15 to 4:00 p.m. and September 9th, 1:15 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. If you can't make it to the Hall then you will have to come to the office to recertify. Please have all of your documentation with you at the time of your appointment. All adults 18 and older must be present. Please allow yourself some time, because there may be a wait. Effective date of rent change will be 11-1-22.
