2024 ANNUAL AGENCY PLAN

The Housing Authority's Board of Commissioners, Staff and Resident Advisory Board will be meeting during the months of October and November to work on the Authority's draft of our Annual Agency Plan. One of the items in the Annual Plan which impacts Public Housing residents significantly is the Capital Fund Program.

Medicare's Annual Enrollment Period is right around the corner. It is from October 15, 2023 to December 7, 2023. If you are like everyone else, you are getting dozens of telephone calls every day trying to get you to switch your plan. You might wish you had a magic button you could use to turn off the calls, and here are some tips.

800 numbers and unsolicited phone calls

- 1) Never call an 800 number you see in an ad.
- 2) Never give your Medicare ID number to someone you don't know over the phone.
- 3) Never click on or fill out forms online or on Facebook.

The promise of getting \$170 per month back or a Flex Card

You see the television commercials, phone calls, and mail regarding "new benefits and plan changes." Most people don't qualify for the advertised benefits but are coerced into something else.

The government recently issued strict new rules regarding advertising, but it hasn't stopped the overseas call centers.

Review your plan. Each plan sends out an Annual Notice of Change (ANOC) by the end of September. Read and see if any of the changes affect you. Many times, the plan changes are to your benefit. Some of the plans this year will have financial help for you to pay for your utilities, over-the-counter items, and food.

Use trusted professionals in our community that know and work full-time in the Medicare business. If you don't know of someone, ask another trusted friend, and look for those active in our community that help others with Medicare.



MANAGER'S NOTES

STRAY CATS: Please do not feed stray cats. We are having major issues with cats at all of our properties. These cats carry fleas and feline diseases. We are receiving complaints daily about cats digging up plants, pet waste all over property, and noise from stray cats. No rescue agency will accept the cats.

FALL LEAF SEASON: Families are responsible for raking their own leaves. We ask that you bag your own leaves and the Housing Authority will remove them for you. You will be charged a fee if we have to rake your leaves. We have bags at the office to give you and will loan you a rake if you need one.

ARE YOU AWARE OF HUD'S OVERNIGHT GUEST POLICY? HUD's policy and your signed lease states that you are allowed to have an overnight guest for 14 total overnights per year, per household.

PETS: All pets must meet the **Housing Authority Pet Policy** and must be registered. You are not allowed to have visiting pets.

HOUSEKEEPING TIPS:

- Wash refrigerator door gaskets with clean soapy water to avoid loss of coolness and your electric bill being higher from not sealing. Your food will also stay fresher if the door seals properly.
- Self-Cleaning Gas Stoves-To save time scrubbing, put the burner grates in the stove when you use the self-clean feature.
- Clean carpet spills as you go using warm water or a spot cleaner. It will save time and be easier to clean.
- Check your produce, especially onions and potatoes and your sacks for unwanted pests when you get home from the grocery store to avoid an infestation of bugs.
- Flushable wipes, tampons, and sanitary napkins are not safe in the toilet.
- Wipe household surfaces on a regular basis so your whole family will be healthier.
- Dryer lint should be cleaned out after every use. This will save you money on your electric bill. It is the
 resident's responsibility to make sure the dryer vent is always clamped and tight. This is the leading cause of
 fires.
- Window frames and entry doors need to be wiped with a bleach-water solution to avoid condensation turning into mildew problems.

Become A Senior Companion:

You know how much you value your independence in your life. Now you can help others stay independent, too! By becoming Senior Companion, you help others stay independent for as long as possible.

- What's Expected: light housekeeping, meal preparation, shopping/errands, companionship, and respect.
- Hours Served: A minimum of 20 hours a week, 4 hours a day.
- Benefits: As a volunteer you will receive paid training and earn \$250 + (tax free) per month. This means that this income will not be counted as part of the income that you have to report.
- Requirements: Volunteers must be 55 or older and meet the income eligibility requirements.

Halloween Safety Tips for Seniors

Seniors should feel safe and secure on Halloween, whether they hand out candy or not. These five Halloween safety tips for seniors can help family caregivers ensure their loved ones enjoy the holiday no matter what, while also providing peace of mind to family members.

- 1. Make sure the house is well lit. Whether you're loved one is going to be away from the house on Halloween, or at home handing out treats, make sure their porch light is working and the exterior and interior of the home is brightly lit.
- 2. Look outside before opening the door. Even though it's Halloween, always check to see who is standing outside before answering the door. If it's a group of unruly teens or a lone adult, keep the door closed as a safety precaution.
- **3. Keep all visitors outside.** Encourage your senior to stay inside when passing out candy and to not allow strangers into the home for any reason. You can also place a bowl of candy on the front porch rather than handing it out. Include a sign that says: "Happy Halloween! One per person, please."
- **4. Keep steps and walkways clear.** Keep all walkways and steps clear of flame-lit jack-o-lanterns, oversized decorations and other décor. Removing items that pose tripping hazards will not only help keep aging loved ones safe, but also the children.
- **5. Keep your loved one company.** Instead of having your elderly loved one hand out Halloween candy alone, join them!

October Facts:


